THE KEY ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE PROJECT

On October 25, the Faculty of Theology at the University of Silesia in Katowice hosted an international conference titled "Transformative Learning through Service: A European Perspective on e-Service Learning". The conference served as a platform to summarize the achievements of the international e-SL4EU project. The event brought together 61 persons: members of the project consortium from 6 countries, external partners, students, and academic and research staff from collaborating universities from 7 countries. During the event, the partners presented the key findings gathered from evaluation forms completed by various target groups during the pilot phase of the e-SL projects conducted by the students. They shared insights relevant to community organizations, highlighted the main strengths and weaknesses of e-SL, and showcased the community social impact generated by e-SL projects.

Additionally, they outlined the most developed skills among students as a result of their participation in the e-SL projects. To make the event more interactive and engaging. partners developed unified the methodology to involve participants in workshop activities. These workshops provided an opportunity to delve deeper into the project results already presented, allowing participants to apply and better understand how these outcomes could influence their teaching practices. The workshops featured the good practices of an e-SL project carried out by students, using role-play methodologies to engage participants and make them active contributors to presentations.
